Eyewitness to our stories

Lens is turned on North Fork

isa Dabrowski and her video camera have been sighted up and down the North Fork this summer, filming various events and interviewing local personalities. It's all part of Ms. Dabrowski's newest creation: an ongoing program broadcast on WVVH-TV that aims to bring "both forks" together, according by Liz Wood to Ernie Schmizzi, owner of the East Hampton studio (see box).

Ms. Dabrowski brings to the program the multiple talents of a mostly selftaught singer-songwriter, poet, painter, photographer, filmmaker, director, editor and producer of theatrical performances. She said she learned technique and ter-minology at a digital filmmaking class at Suffolk County Community College, "but most of what I've learned, I've learned on my own."

In her programs, she said, "I want to represent the North Fork that I love and cherish, not commercially, but in its unique qualities. There's no end of topics,

subjects and people to interview." She has already filmed the 150th an-niversary of Horton Point Lighthouse and this year's Mattituck Strawberry Festival, the centenary celebration of New Suffolk School, the Cutchogue Fire Department and the annual tractor pull at Hallockville

Museum Farm. She may also appear on location in costume to perform the stories she films. "I learn a little piece of history every time," Ms. Dabrowski said.

What drives her desire to make and record the history of this area is her "pride in my family's history." Her grandparents on both sides emigrated to Riverhead from Poland and Eastern Europe at the turn of the 19th century and, like many Polish settlers, founded local farms and businesses.

One grandfather, John Jackowski, founded the Long Island Duck Processing Plant in Riverhead; the other, Mieczyslaw

Dabrowski ("known as Caesar" for having served in World War I as General Pershing's bodyguard and interpreter), had a wicker business in Aquebogue.

in Aquebogue.

A grandmother, Mary Jackowski, at age 92 "still lives in the family home that was moved across the fields at Calverton after the duck farm along Peconic River was sold to the U.S. Navy for Grumman," Ms. Dabrowski said. Her other grandmother, Angeline Dabrowski, taught her the Polish songs and dances of her own childhood and, like Ms. Dabrowski's mother, Mary, "a huge Elvis fan" and pianist, inspired young Lisa with a love of music.

Her twin aunts, Helen and Irene Dabrowski, have occupied the same family home at Aquebogue for 77 years. And her father, Conrad, who worked on farm equipment at Rolle Brothers in Riverhead and retired from Brookhaven National Laboratory, inspired her passion for old cars.

So it comes as no surprise that in

So it comes as no surprise that in 1999 the Town of Riverhead made Ms. Dabrowski a Goodwill Ambassador before her trips to Poland to research her family roots, or that the one-time family historian now creates history herself.

A short poem in Ms. Dabrowski's first book, "The Shutters of My Soul" (2000), that faces a photograph of Grandfather "Caesar" in his World War I uniform, reads:

The ghost of a soldier Has dwelt in our home, His presence is felt, His name is unknown.

If Ms. Dabrowski has her way, the North Fork's ghosts will all be named and its stories, then and now, will be made known.
